

LEGISLATIVE POLITICAL ACTION TEAM (LPAT)

Greetings Fellow Activists!

I want to **thank you** for your work in contacting our State Representatives and Senators regarding the pension reform legislation which was passed in November. As a result of the efforts of MTA activists like you, well over 350 personal contacts with legislators occurred and thousands of emails were sent. We did make a difference in the final outcome. Some of these differences were: Higher Ed members will be able to opt out of the Optional Retirement Program and transfer to the state system and the COLA base for retirees was increased to \$13, 000.00.

The upcoming year is going to challenge us in a number of ways, the Presidential election along with the election for Massachusetts United States Senate and the re-districting of the congressional seats. We will also be lobbying our state reps and senators regarding two MTA sponsored bills, one to do a study to provide adequate funding for public education and the other to consider a change in the state income tax structure that would benefit our middle class and lower income residents as well as provide realistic funding for state provided services.

Other news to report out is that I have purchased a copy of **American Teacher** and IT HAS ARRIVED! I am hoping that we can invite members to local viewings of this important film and engage them in a dialogue that will lead to their becoming a part of our activist teams.

Our next LPAT meeting will be on January 24 (4:30-6:00 PM) at the Southeast Office in Raynham (Wynn and Wynn building)and refreshments will be served.
